It contains the fundamentals of the Christian faith and what the church should look like in deed as well as thought. As Stott himself says, It is the nearest thing to a manifesto that he ever uttered, for it is his own description of what he wanted his I appreciate John Stott's sincerity, insight, and writing style, so I expected to learn a lot with this book. I was not disappointed.Â The book contains an introduction, then a straight-forward commentary on the text grouped by verses of related thought in the standard manner, and followed by a study guide on the sermon for small group study or Sunday School. There are no indices, which I find disappointing for a scholarly work.
