Defining Learning Disabilities Review of the literature on learning disabilities suggest that the term "learning disability" in itself is too elusive to be of any use for program planning. An impact evaluation provides information about the impacts produced by an intervention - positive and negative, intended and unintended, direct and indirect. This means that an impact evaluation must establish what has been the cause of observed changes (in this case "impacts" referred to as causal attribution (also referred to as causal inference). An impact evaluation approach that iteratively maps available evidence against a theory of change, then identifies and addresses challenges to causal inference.
