**Students:** A student ID is required to check out items from the library and to use items on reserve in the library. Please bring your ID card to the circulation desk to be entered into the library system.

**Faculty and staff:** A library card is required to check out items from the library including AV equipment. If you do not already have a card in the library, please come to the circulation desk to get one.

## Things You Might Not Know about the Library

You know that you can do research in the library; but did you know that the reference librarian can assist you in obtaining the information you need?

Were you aware that the Lee and Harnett libraries have study rooms available? If you need a place to study with a group, or study without distraction, they can provide that. If you want to take advantage of a break in your schedule of traditional classes to view a college-by-cassette videotape or DVD, you can do that in the study rooms. Also, all the libraries have carrels available in the back of the library that provide individual seating.

Did you know the libraries have some movies you can check out? What about curling up with a good mystery or romance -- paperback and bestseller collections are available. Did you know the Lee campus library has a large music collection on CD? Did you know we have some books on audiocassette?

## **You Don't Have the Book I Want— How Do I Get It?**

The CCCC Library provides two different ways to get books from other libraries. The library is a member of a consortium of 44 libraries known as CCLINC (Community Colleges Libraries In North Carolina). Through the library catalog, items can be located at any or all of these libraries. To request a book from another library, you may call or come by a CCCC library or if you already have a library card, you may request the book online through the catalog. For instructions on how to do this, please call any of the campus libraries. The book will be sent to a CCCC library for you to check out. There is no charge for this service. Books usually arrive within one-two weeks.

Books that are not available at a CCLINC library can also be ordered through another type of interlibrary loan. If you are unable to locate a book through CCLINC, the interlibrary loan librarian, Ellen Viggiano, will try to get the book from another library. To request a book, please call the library or come by and fill out a yellow interlibrary loan form. A library card is also required for this type of interlibrary loan. Obtaining a book by this process usually takes longer--sometimes up to a month.

### **From the Media Librarian**

New AV equipment is available for checkout **by staff for college purposes:** CD players, PowerPoint remotes, and additional laptops and data projectors. The new employee orientation on October 11 will cover checkout procedures and use of the AV equipment.



### **Library Instruction**

The goal of the library staff is to help each library user become knowledgeable, comfortable, and independent in accessing information through contemporary library technology and basic resources. To help achieve this goal, a variety of instructional classes are available for students, faculty, and staff.
