

Madden gives less attention than expected to Steinbrenner's career as ship owner and, more surprisingly, to the championship seasons of the last 13 years, though the owner has been less visible in recent years. For Lil, my "first read," who provided insight I had not seen Steinbrenner since he'd been banished from baseball by Commissioner Fay Vincent in 1990, and had not spoken to him since he'd fired Lou Piniella as Yankees manager for the second time, after the 1988 season. Throughout the '70s and '80s, I'd enjoyed a mostly pleasant working relationship with Steinbrenner in my capacity as a baseball writer for United Press International and then the New York Daily News, perhaps in no small part because my bosses and mentors at both places, Milton Richman at UPI and Dick Young at the News, were both legendary baseball writers.
