"If the Story Could be Heard&a Prophecy of the Swan is the work of three archaeologists w h o have placed the findings and conclusions from their digs along the Peace River into the historical context of the fur trade during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Overtly interdisciplinary in its focus, this book verifies Fort St John's claim to being the oldest non-Native settlement in British Columbia and documents the aggressive competitiveness of the fur trade in the years preceding the 18 21 amalgamation of the Hudson's Bay Company and the North West Company. T h e greatest accomplishment of this book
