Economic Analysis.Â Section 401 authorizes States and Tribes to certify that a discharge into waters of the United States that may result from a proposed activity will comply with certain enumerated sections of the CWA, including the effluent limitations and standards of performance for new and existing discharge sources (sections 301, 302, and 306 of the CWA), water quality standards and implementation plans. The Code contains an amendment sheet which provides the current revision status of amendments, chapters and pages (an example appears below) against which the revision status may be checked. Page revisions are indicated by a change in the number after the decimal point:- e.g. Rev1.02, Rev1.03, etc., while chapter revisions are indicated by a change in the number before the decimal point:- e.g. Rev2.01, Rev3.01, etc. (page revision reverts to 01).Â Much of the Code relates to matters which are the subject of such regulations.Â 8. Non-UK ships are not subject to all UK safety regulations, although failure to meet international standards of safety enshrined in those regulations may result in enforcement action while the ship is in UK waters. This receipt or certificate, if attached to the Oil Record Book Part I, may aid the master of the ship in proving that his ship was not involved in an alleged pollution incident. Example #4: Draining of water (disposal) from an oil residue (sludge) tank listed under item 3.1 in the Supplement to the IOPPC, to a bilge water holding tank listed under item 3.3 in the Supplement to the IOPPC.Â Example #12: Pumping of bilge water overboard from tank listed in item 3.3 in the Supplement to the IOPPC. Example #13: Disposal of bilge water from tank listed in item 3.3 in the Supplement to the IOPPC to oil residue (sludge) tank listed in item 3.1 in the Supplement to the IOPPC.
